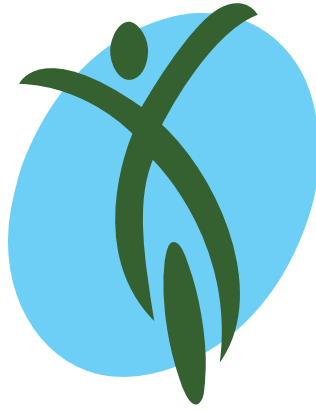

Wye Marsh Wildlife Centre

Wye Marsh Wildlife Centre is a not-for-profit, charitable organization spanning 3,000 acres of National Wildlife Area and Provincially Significant Wetlands and woodlands in Tay, Ontario in the Heart of Georgian Bay. These wetlands are home to a number of diverse species, including listed species such as Blanding's Turtles and Trumpeter Swans. The Captive Wildlife Care department at Wye Marsh hosts 8 birds of prey, 4 turtles, and 1 snake who cannot be released into the wild and require specialized care. Species monitoring, developing pollinator friendly spaces, and invasive species control are among the stewardship initiatives undertaken by Wye Marsh staff and volunteers.

The Trails:

Explore woodland & wetland trails, featuring the Great Lakes-St. Lawrence forest region and a provincially significant wetland (cattail marsh). The majority of trails are hard packed.

St. Marie Among the Hurons

Ontario's first European Community, Sainte-Marie was the headquarters for the French Jesuit Mission to the Wendat people. In 1639, the Jesuits, along with French lay workers, began construction of a palisaded community that included barracks, a church, workshops, residences, and a sheltered area for Indigenous visitors. By 1648, Sainte-Marie was home to 66 French men — one-fifth of the entire population of New France. Sainte-Marie's history ended in 1649, when members of the mission community were forced to abandon and burn their home of ten years.

Awenda Provincial Park

Awenda offers a nice variety of looped and linear, easy to moderate trails and range from 1 to 13 km in length. One trail provides barrier-free access.

Beach Trail – 4 km return (1.5 hours) linear, easy

Beaver Pond Trail – 700m (30 minutes) loop, easy, barrier free

Bluff Trail – 13 km (3.5 hours) loop, moderate

Nipissing Trail – 1 km return (30 minutes) linear, moderate

Brûlé Trail - 4 km return (1.5 hours) linear, easy

Robitaille Homestead Trail – 3 km return (1hour) linear, easy

Wendat Trail – 5 km (2 hours) loop, easy

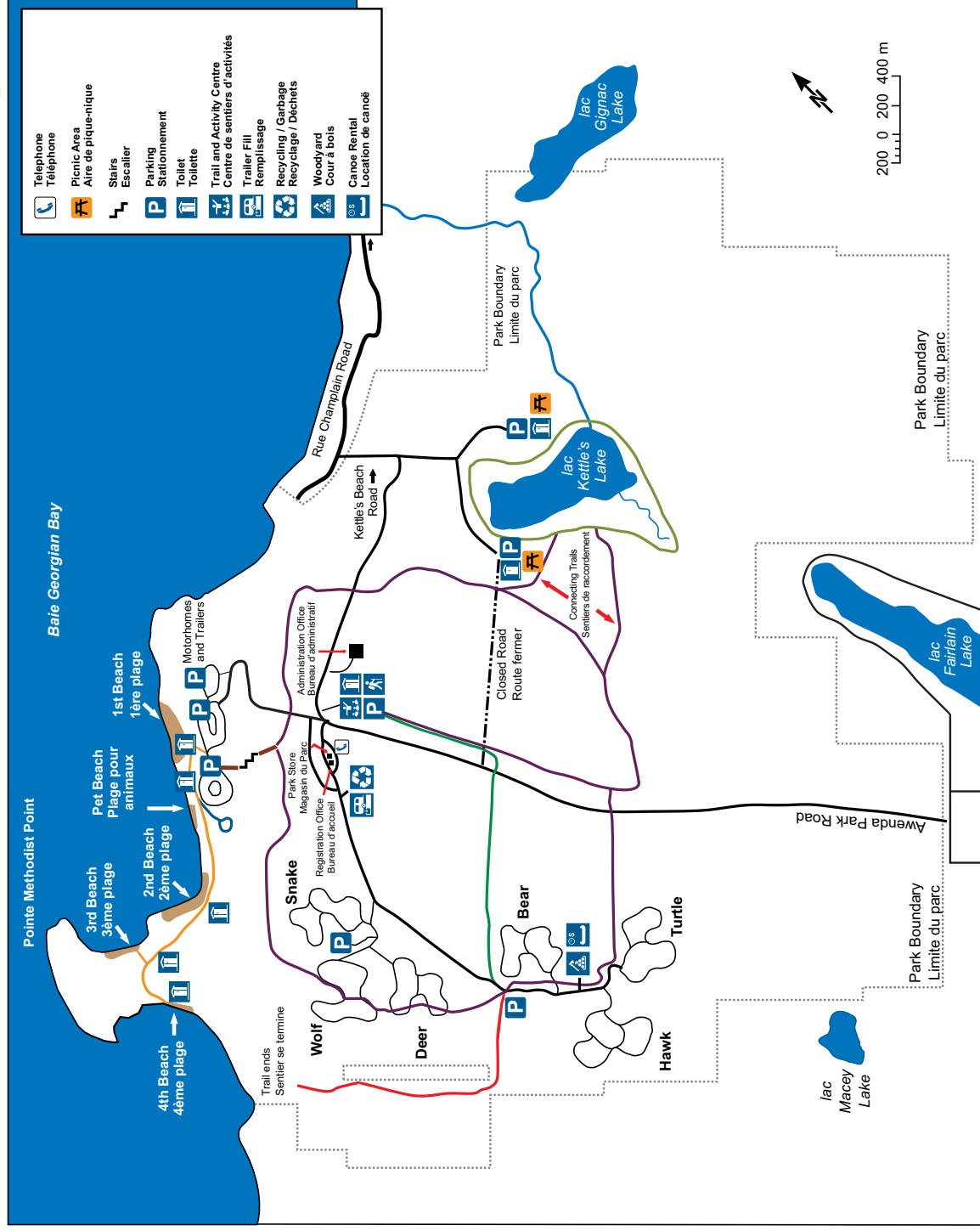

Midland Town and Waterfront Hike (11km or 14km)

11k or 14km--You have options—This route starts right at the Hotel and heads 4km toward the Midland Rotary Waterfront Trail, then it's 4.5km of lovely waterfront walking! Once you reach the Harbour the route takes King St. As far as Little Lake Park Trails around the 10km point, where you can make a little diversion into the trails, or continue straight back to the start.

10km Route: By skipping the Little Lake Park trails, you will take 3km off the total making it a 11km hike, rather than 14k.
